




Proposed Geothermal Energy in Lílwat Territory

What is geothermal energy?

Geothermal energy harnesses heat that naturally occurs within the Earth. Wells of up to a mile deep or more are drilled underground to tap into naturally occurring hot water. This water is used to create steam, which drives turbines to produce electricity.

This is considered a clean, renewable energy source.



Where is geothermal energy development being proposed?

A geothermal energy development project is being proposed at the base of **Qwelqwelústen** (Mount Meager) in **Stuqálts** (Upper Lillooet River watershed). **Qwelqwelústen** is reflected in Lílwat oral history and means "cooked face place" or "really hot face."

Lílwat Nation is undertaking a thorough review of the project to understand the benefits and impacts of the project on Lilwat7úl and Ucwalmícw Tmicw. This review includes a traditional use study, an environmental review, and a study to examine social and economic conditions and impacts.
