Lílwat Lands and Resources continues to work together with N'Quatqua and BC Parks on the Visitor Use Management Strategy for Joffre Lakes Park. Our Skél7awlh will have a presence on the trails again this year conducting wildlife

surveys and keeping their eyes on the Land. The Day Use Pass system will be in operation again this year to moderate the number of visitors.

Class Action Lawsuit

The Lílwat Nation Chiefs and Council authorized Chief Dean Nelson to Opt-In to the Class Action Lawsuit. The Band Reparations Class Action is a lawsuit against the Government of Canada. The lawsuit is about the collective harm suffered by Indigenous communities as a group as a result of Indian Residential Schools. 325 First Nations across Canada opted in.

On Reserve members visit Stl'atl'imx Tribal Police Service & Off Reserve members visit a RCMP office.


