HAVE YOU HEARD?



The Government is providing two rebates, one for groceries and one for the increased cost-of-living. You do NOT need to apply for these rebates, as long as you have already filed your taxes these rebates will be added in with your GST payment.

If you don't want to miss out on this rebate but haven't yet filed your taxes, then don't hesitate to bring your tax slips into the front desk of Úllus and we will file your taxes for you as a free service.

"The new one-time Grocery Rebate is for low and modest-income Canadians and families, with up to an extra \$467 for eligible couples with two children; up to an extra \$234 for single Canadians without children; and an extra \$225 for seniors, on average. The Grocery Rebate will be delivered to eligible Canadians by direct deposit or cheque through the Canada Revenue Agency"

Hike to Múmleqs (Keyhole) and the Visitor Use management Strategy The Visitor Use Management Strategy for Nqw'elqw'elústen (Meager Creek) and Múmleqs (Keyhole) Hotsprings was developed in March of 2021. This strategy has been jointly undertaken by Lílwat Nation and the Ministry of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development (FLNRORD), in collaboration with the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

Nqw'elqw'elústen and Múmeqs Hotsprings are both natural hotsprings in the remote St'uqált's (Upper Lillooet River Valley), located about 60 kilometers northwest of the Village of Pemberton, within the territory of the Lílwat Nation. Both hotsprings, and the river valleys in which they are situated, have significant cultural and spiritual values, wildlife and ecological values, and recreational values. Both hotsprings are protected as A7x7ūlmecw (Spirited Ground Areas), and are important spiritual, cultural and food gathering areas for Lílwat Nation. Stories of these sacred grounds are shared in the novel 'The Lílwat World of Charlie Mack'.

Unfortunately, both hotsprings have seen negative impacts from unmanaged recreation visitation in the past, beginning in the 1980s when the area became accessible by vehicle and popular with the settler population.

To this day, our Lílwat Lands and Resources staff continue to work together with FLNRORD and Natural Resource Development in the stewardship of these unique, and sacred lands. Recently our team participated in a hike and site visit to Múmleqs. We offered a ceremony by drumming a song, and sage smudging our crew to help us get through the work we intended to do.

Emergency Preparedness Checklist
