

We have 3 new SMARTBOARDS here at Ts'zil that will help our programs/classes/courses with a better connectivity and technology approach into some of the programs, and we have a new display screen at the main entrance that will display program classroom times/schedules etc.

We will use a smartboard and do live streaming of our ucwalmicwts Blue Book and alphabet; we are still working out the details, we will also be looking into Traditional Medicines workshops with our Culture team and learning about teas, salves, and other traditional medicines, and the other program is beginner basket weaving; for beginners, learning about harvesting the roots, preparation and the art of basketry. - Unemployed or underemployed

Eligibility Criteria

- b) Demonstrates the Spirit of what Harris brought forward in the workplace and life: dedication to work and community, leadership, teamwork etc.
- c) Be in good academic standing with the Nation and the Post-Secondary institution; and
- d) Must not have any funds owing to the Ts'zil Learning Centre Post-Secondary for current or previous sponsorship.

Nomination and Review Process

We are asking that fellow workmates, teammates, peers, employers, teachers etc. nominate a person they have watched overcome challenges, engage in training opportunities, and accomplish goals in the carpentry industry.
